Selection events & scoring

- **29er**
 - 2 selection events:
 - Spring Dinghies (Royal Victoria Yacht Club) & Icebreaker (Calgary Yacht Club)
 - Low point system as defined in the RRS 2021-2024
 - Discarded races will be tied to each events sailed
 - **ILCA 7**
 - 2 selection events:
 - Kitten Cup (Royal Vancouver Yacht Club) & Founders (Wabamun Sailing Club)
 - Low point system as defined in the RRS 2021-2024
 - Discarded races will be tied to each events sailed
 - **ILCA 6**
 - 2 selection events:
 - Kitten Cup (Royal Vancouver Yacht Club) & Founders (Wabamun Sailing Club)
 - Low point system as defined in the RRS 2021-2024
 - Discarded races will be tied to each events sailed
 - **2.4mr**
 - 1 selection event:
 - Icebreaker (Calgary Yacht Club)
 - Low point system as defined in the RRS 2021-2024.
- If no selection events can be raced, Alberta Canada Games Team manager and Team coach will choose the athletes representing Alberta at the Canada summer games at their sole discretion.

Mandatory event

Selected athletes must attend the Pre-Cork training event.
(just before CORK international. Dates/length TBD)

Selected team member should make every effort to attend any event/course from Alberta Sports (GoA) asks us to participate in.
such as but not limited to the Team Alberta Staging event & managing medias course.

Athlete retiring/unable to compete

- Should an athlete retire or is unable to compete at the Canada Summer games after being selected, the athlete who was second.
 - In case a single member of a team retires, the remaining team member remains qualified for the Canada Summer Games and the Alberta Sailing Staff will work with said the remaining athlete to find the most suitable replacement.

Appeal Procedure

- An athlete shall be given 48 hours from the time of the team announcement or notice of removal from the team to request an appeal. The athlete must request it in writing to the president & Sailing director of the Alberta Sailing Association.

- The Appeals Committee is comprised of one of each of the following:
 - Chair of the Committee/President of the ASA (who will only vote in case of a tie)
 - ASA board member representative
 - Coach representative (someone not involved in the Canada Games)
 - Official representative (A Sail Canada registered race officer or jury)
 - Athlete representative (Retired from competitive dingy racing)
- The name of the above committee will be communicated to the athlete requesting the appeal no later than 24 hours after the appeal has been requested
- An appeal shall be heard ONLY on the grounds that the selection process and final decision was flawed not because the athlete did not like the decision.
- The appeals committee shall review the letter and decide whether the request has grounds for a hearing. They shall also review all selection procedure documentation from the Selection Committee.
 - If there are no legitimate grounds for appeal, the Chair of the Appeals Committee shall call the athlete advising them of their decision. This will be followed up with a formal letter to the athlete.
 - If the Appeals Committee feels there are grounds for an appeal hearing, the appeal hearing procedures will be followed:

Appeal Hearing Procedures

- The Chair of the Appeals Committee shall select a designated place, date and time to hear the appeal. This will be done no later than 48 hours upon receipt of the appeal request.
- The Appeals Committee shall hear the athlete's complaint. They may be accompanied by an athlete advocate (parent or guardian or legal advisor, etc.)
- The Appeals Committee shall hear from the Selection Committee representative (the Canada games team manager/sailing director of the ASA).
- The Appeals Committee will make a final decision at the appeal hearing and the decision shall be final and binding.
- The Chair of the Appeals Committee will contact the athlete no later than 24 hours after the hearing by phone to advise them of the outcome and this will be followed up by a formal letter and copy of the appeal findings and recommendation.
- The Chair of the Appeals Committee will contact the Coach by phone to advise him of the outcome. This will be followed up by a copy of the formal letter to the athlete and a copy of the appeal findings and recommendation.
- The athlete who submits an appeal must be prepared to cover their own expenses during the process (i.e. travel to the hearing). The ASA will make every effort to minimize such costs.

Eligibility requirements:

Athletes must meet the Athlete Eligibility Policy and any Canada Summer games Policies

- **Citizenship**
 - Athletes must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents.
- **Residency**
 - An athlete's permanent residence must be located, at least 180 days prior to the Opening Ceremony, within the recognized boundaries of the province/territory they wish to represent. An athlete can only have one permanent residence.
 - Should an athlete not meet the residency requirement, they may be ruled as eligible
 - An athlete may represent a province/territory that falls outside the recognized boundaries of their permanent residence provided they can demonstrate a commitment to the province/territory they wish to represent by: Having been a member of a club or P/TSO in that province/territory for the entire previous or current competitive season;
-AND-
 - Having represented that province/territory at a national or regional championship (if applicable);
-AND-
 - Not having received direct development funding from their province/territory of permanent residence within a year of the Opening Ceremony, unless the funding jurisdiction provides permission for the athlete to compete for another team;

-OR- Other similar circumstances may be considered.
 - Athletes attending school on a full-time basis outside their province/territory of permanent residence during the year of the Canada Games shall be permitted to compete for either their province/territory of permanent residence or the province/territory in which the athlete attends school.
- **Membership:**
 - Athletes must be registered members in good standing of their sports provincial/territorial sport organization (P/TSO)
- **Gender:**
 - ILCA7: Male
 - ILCA6: Female
 - 29er: Male Team
 - 29er: Female Team
 - 2.4: Any gender
- **Age:**
 - ABLE BODIED: 15-22 as of December 31, 2022
 - Year of birth: 2000-2007
 - PARA: 15-35 as of December 31, 2022
 - Year of birth: 1987-2007

- ***Athletes Excluded from the Canada Games are:***
 - Senior National Team Members - defined as: Athletes who have held an SR, SR1, SR2 or C1 card at any time; and/or athletes who are part of (on the roster of) a standing Senior National Team (i.e. recognized as Senior National Team member regardless of event participation)
 - Athletes who have previously competed at the following events:
 - Senior World Championships
 - Olympic Games
 - Paralympic Games
 - Pan Am Games
- ***General***
 - An athlete is permitted to try out for any P/T they are eligible to compete for, but can only try out for one P/T per sport.
 - Athletes may not compete in two sports at one Canada Games if they are scheduled in the same week.
 - Athletes may only compete for one province/territory at a single Canada Games.
