# ALBERTA SAILING ASSOCIATION GENERAL AND SPECIAL MEETING VOTING REPRESENTATIVE GUIDELINE January 12, 2018

## 1. Purpose and Principles

- 1. This guideline provides an explanation of how many Voting Delegates a Member Organization may send to an Alberta Sailing Association (ASA) meeting;
- 2. The guideline is based on Section 2.6 of the ASA Bylaws.

#### 2. Interpretation

In this policy:

- 1. Member Organizations are identified in Section 2.6 of the ASA Bylaws:
  - a. Sailing Clubs;
  - b. Community Clubs;
  - c. Sailing Schools.
- 2. A Voting Delegate may cast a vote on motions at ASA meetings.
- 3. Active Member is a fully paid member of the ASA.

### 3. Application and Scope

- 1. This Guideline applies to all Member Organizations and Voting Delegates.
- 2. Voting Delegates must be fully paid Active Members of the ASA.
- 3. Associate Members are members of a family that has at least one Active Member of the ASA. Associate Members cannot vote at meetings of the ASA.

#### 4. Voting Delegates

1. Sailing Club:

Number of Active Members	Number of Voting Delegates
10 to 50 Members	1
51 to 199 Members	2
200 to 299 Members	3
Each additional 100 Members in full	+1 Voting Delegate

- 2. Community Club with a minimum of five (5) Active Members receives one (1) Voting Delegate.
- 3. A Sailing School will be allowed one (1) Voting Delegate.
- 4. Individual Members as defined in the ASA Bylaws do not have a Voting Delegate representative but may be a Voting Delegate of a Member Organization.
- 5. Voting Delegates must be declared to the ASA 30 days before a General and Special Meetings of the ASA.
- 6. Proxy Voting will not be allowed.
- 7. The Board may suspend the rights of a Member Organization if the Member Organization is more than 90 days in Arears on money owed to the ASA.
